

CLUB BYLAWS

- 1) **Eligible Members:** Membership is open to any person who currently owns and rides motorcycle or three-wheeler 35 years old or older and who agrees to abide by the rules and bylaws of this club. Membership shall be limited to 150 ordinary members.
- 2) **Eligible Machines:** The club's primary focus is on motorcycles and three-wheelers 35 years old or more, and members shall only ride vehicles that meet this criteria on sanctioned Classic Motorcycle Riders Club of WA (CRMCA) club events.
- 3) **Code of Behaviour:**
 - a) All members are to abide by the Club Rules and By-Laws.
 - b) Members are to treat each other with courtesy and respect. Abuse of any type is not acceptable.
 - c) Members must have a current driver's licence for the class of bike being ridden.

4) **Concessional Licensing:**

The Club is currently an approved club for Code 404 concessional licensing. The club shall maintain this approved status and assist members to concessionally license eligible vehicles.

As a service to members the Club will also assist with concessional licensing eligible post 1979 motorcycles and allow them to be included on the club register, on the understanding that these motorcycles will not be used on sanctioned CMRCWA events.

- 5) **Management Committee:** The Management Committee shall consist of the President (Chairperson), the Secretary, the Treasurer and two elected committee members
- 6) **Club Appointments:** The Management Committee shall appoint a club registrar, a newsletter editor, a club clothing co-ordinator and any other positions as may be required. Their duties are:

a) **Registrar.**

The registrar is responsible to the club committee and shall:

- i) maintain the register of concessional licensed vehicles within the club and provide an up-to-date copy of this register to the secretary;
- ii) sign and issue CMC1 forms as required, after confirming that vehicle is eligible, the member is financial and that the vehicle is unmodified;
- iii) establish and maintain vehicle files for each concessional vehicle;
- iv) provide such information as is required by the committee and/or the secretary;

- v) keep up to date on Code 404 conditions, advise the committee of any changes and develop procedures as required to manage any changes;
- vi) act as the club's representative to the Council of Motoring Clubs (CMC), attend CMC meetings and report to the committee and the club.

b) Newsletter Editor

The newsletter Editor is responsible to the club committee and shall prepare the club newsletter and submit it to the committee for review and distribution to members.

c) Clothing Co-ordinator:

The Clothing Co-ordinator is responsible to the club committee and shall:

- i) Liaise with the committee on clothing requirements and arrange for the purchase of club clothing and paraphernalia;
 - ii) Manage the sales of clothing and paraphernalia to club members;
 - iii) Provide an annual report to the committee on the status of the club clothing and sales. The report shall be submitted within 14 days of the end of the club's financial year.
- 7) **Newsletter:** The club shall produce a monthly newsletter and distribute it by email to members. The newsletter may be mailed to members without email addresses, and the committee may increase the subscription for these members to cover the additional costs involved.
- 8) **Club Events and Club Meetings:** The club event calendar shall be based on regular club rides for eligible motorcycles on the first Sunday of each month, although this may be varied by the committee where the first Sunday falls on a long weekend, or where it conflicts with another significant vintage motorcycling event. A minimum of nine general meetings will be held each year, coincident with the regular club runs.
- In addition to these regular runs the club will encourage and support additional rides, including overnight rides, and encourage the use of club eligible vehicles.
- 9) **Senior Members:** When, for reasons of age or disability, a member is no longer able to ride a motorcycle, the committee may offer that member a senior membership. This membership will entitle the member to attend club events and receive a copy of the club newsletter and other information. The member will be given a new number from 201 onward, and the membership subscription will be 50% of the full membership.
- 10) **Disciplinary Measures:** If a member contravenes the club rules and bylaws or acts detrimentally to the interests of the club, then the committee may take a range of disciplinary measures including a written reprimand, suspension from the club and cancellation of membership.
